Andrew Black 'On Clogger Lane'

Andrew Black is showing his first solo exhibition in London.

It includes his new film, made as part of the Margaret Tait Award 2021 with LUX Scotland.

The exhibition will be open from 19th January 2024 to 10th March 2024.

The exhibition is open every Thursday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday from 12PM to 4PM.

About the film:

The film title is 'On Clogger Lane'.

The film travels through the Washburn Valley near Otley and Harrogate, which is overlooked by a large satellite observation station and hidden under reservoirs.

The film looks at how money affects the land and includes stories about witches and people from the past.

In the film, Andrew talks with local women who fought against the Royal Air Force Menwith Hill site. As well as other people who share evidence about industry, history, and stories in the Washburn Valley, showing various layers of what people have done.

About the Artist:

Andrew Black was born in Leeds and has lived in Glasgow since the year 2009.

He's been part of different art projects, like the Experimental Film & Moving Image Residency at Cove Park.

Recently, he worked with Atlas Arts and exhibited at Centre Clark in Montreal.

Andrew Black received the Margaret Tait Award 2021 for his contributions to experimental film and moving image art.

The Margaret Tait Award is a LUX Scotland project with Glasgow Film, supported by The National Lottery through Creative Scotland.
